OUR MISSION

Rebuilding Together Long Island, Inc. is a not-for-profit organization that brings together communities and volunteers through home repair and modification projects that serve low-income homeowners who are elderly, disabled, veterans and families with children. The organization has completed more than 1,800 projects and is funded by donations from individuals, foundations, corporations, community groups and various grants. Since the initiative began in 1992, nearly 300 volunteers have shared their skills to create warm and safe living environments that allow benefitting families and individuals to maintain independence and homeownership.
